Course Title:	History and culture of Kyrgyzstan

Course Description:	<p>The introduction of such a scientific discipline as national history in the list of compulsory subjects taught to students meets the general requirements of the Ministry of Education of the Kyrgyz Republic. It is designed to facilitate the understanding of the peculiarities of the historical development of the Kyrgyz Republic, including economic, political and cultural aspects, which allows students to integrate more quickly and organically into the local environment, more successfully apply their knowledge in practice and learn new knowledge in the learning process. Additional understanding of the development of society and the basic laws of history has traditionally been a part of any education, regardless of the direction of study and specialization.
